## Uplift's Inaugural Mental Health Conference

Uplift is responding to the metal health crises that, in some way impacts all of us, but impacts justice involved individuals more significantly and acutely. A sobering fact, mental disorders in the incarcerated population are 3 to 12 times higher than that of the general community.

This free, live-streamed event will be accessible to all through our Facebook page on October 3, 2024, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

"The objective of the conference is to improve the understanding of mental illness, reduce the stigma around mental health, and increase access to necessary help for those who need it," says Uplift Board Member, Keir Bradford-Grey who was the brainchild behind the event.

Five high quality workshops will be delivered throughout the day by leading experts in the mental health space. The event will culminate with a panel discussion featuring formerly incarcerated individuals, their family members, and friends.

## Donnel Brown to Serve as Trauma-Informed Workforce Development Facilitator

Donnel Brown is the latest addition to Uplift's Instructor's staff. She will provide all the classroom instruction for the Professional Development portion of the CDL Class B program. Professional Development teaches essential emotional intelligence such as identifying one's talents, healing from past mistakes, the art of forgiveness of others and oneself, and mental health awareness and coping skills. CBT and DBT and trauma therapy are also a part of the curriculum.

"My goal is to make sure I help our students to become as mentally fit as possible, so they have the stamina to go through the technical training of learning how to drive Class B vehicles," Brown says.

Brown is enthusiastic about Uplift's work and understands the immediate need to help justice impacted individuals get the training they need to build a new life for themselves. Brown holds a Master of Science from American University and has experience in Criminology and Human Services. She is also a returning citizen who has first-hand knowledge of prison life and the challenges of integrating back into society.

"Our students must manage reunification with family members, courts, custody, child support, baby mama/daddy drama. It is so easy to give up. I want to make sure they stay on the course and find meaningful work. You can be resilient and overcome trauma. You can rise above all the barriers society puts in front of you," she says. Brown is most grateful for her new position and loves the team comradery and dignity that Uplift staff members show to each other as well as to every single student. "Uplift's leadership is amazing. Everyone works well together and is enthusiastic about their work," she says.

## New College Intern to Lead Special Projects

Ethan Medal-Katz is our newest College Intern that has been added to our team. Ethan currently studies Political Science and Philosophy at the University of Michigan and looks forward to gaining tangible experience helping justice-impacted individuals.
